- 3. Work of the Church Ministries
 - Strategic Plan Update Debbie Farson and John McRae (Leadership Summit Prep)
 - In Jan. 2024, we will sign an agreement with SLI for Ideal Curtis to continue strategic planning coaching with us for another year. Total is \$4,000, which does not include her travel expenses to come here 2 - 3 times per year. This total is about \$500 lower than expected.
 - Please mark your calendars for the 2/4/24 Leadership Summit. It will start with lunch at noon and run until 4pm. Focus will be "How are we becoming leaders who courageously share God's unconditional love?" Invite your teams and others you would like to join your teams. Consider responses to Time and Talent cards when looking for people to invite.
 - The emphasis these last few months has been on communication. The staff has done a terrific job taking suggestions on enhanced communication and making them happen.
 Examples - Handouts with bulletins that list upcoming events, messaging that explains engage/connect/equip/send, greater visibility of our mission to courageously share God's unconditional love.
 - Engage Barb Roach and Joe Salucci (Results of the Fall Festival & Caroling on the Corner)
 - The Engage team wound down the year with two final Fresh Expressions and Our December Caroling on the Corner event on Dec 3rd.
 - The last two Fresh Expressions of the year were both very well attended. We had a final S'mores and Scriptures led by Pastor Jon on November 13th which brought out around 14 people including several friends and neighbors of Aldersgate members.
 - And then on November 15th, Leah hosted our first ever Pickleball fresh Expression to which over a dozen folks came out and were given a one-hour lesson and another hour of playing time at Collingwood park. It was so successful that there is talk of holding this event monthly in the winter as long as the weather cooperates.
 - On December 3rd, Caroling on the Corner was led and hosted by Noelle Salucci and she did a wonderful job even as we had to pivot and move the event indoors when the rain and mist made it too damp to hold outside. Founders Hall slowly filled to capacity as around 75 church and community members gathered for fellowship, scripture readings and caroling followed up with Hot Cocoa and cookies. Thank you to all who participated, helped with set up and breakdown or who attended and brought a friend or neighbor. It was a wonderful

way to kick off the Advent season.

- The final Engage event of the year is the live Nativity Animals who will once again be with us on Christmas Eve. Patricia Barron and Carol Brown will be hosting this event (on the Front lawn if the weather is nice and under the Awning by door 3 if it is raining.) We are working on lighting the area on the front lawn better than it has been in the past for this event.
- Pastor Jon, and the Engage team leads will be meeting next week to work on our calendar for 2024- if anyone on the leadership team Is interested in hosting a Fresh Expression event next year- we are always looking for new ways to gather in Christ's name and bring folks together for learning, fellowship and fun. Please let Barb, Joe or Pastor Jon know what you might be interested in teaching or leading.
- Connect Connections, John Driscoll and Christine McElwain (Deck the Hall Feedback)
 - <u>Welcome Bags</u>: The new green bags are in. We're in good shape regarding supplies.
 - <u>Church Christmas Decorating</u>: Decorating went well. We had a good volunteer turnout and the Church looks great. January 7 will be Un-Deck the Halls. I'll be setting up a signup genius page with instructions for volunteers. I hope to have this done in about a week or less.
 - <u>Christmas Services</u>: We are still looking for volunteers for usher and communion servers. Steve, myself and the worship team are finalizing instructions for volunteers. We'll send those out by email.
 - <u>Signup Genius Pages</u>: Ushers, Communion Servers, Lay Readers, Fellowship Time pages are up to date.
- Connect Worship, Steve Larkin and Dave Halladay (Advent Preparation)
 - Weekly worship attendance for November averaged 220. Recruiting volunteers continues to be a problem. For Christmas Eve, 3,5, 7 and 9:00PM worship leads have been identified. They will be responsible for checking volunteers in and directing them to their assignments. We are short one sanctuary ushers and two ushers and three communion servers for Founders Hall. Emails have been sent to the usher and communion server volunteer list.
- Equip Education, Sue Kane and Leslie Belcher
 - Two more groups completed the Disciple's Path class, under the leadership of Ann and John Nelson (9:30) and Diane Barbe and Leslie Belcher (11:00). Another class is already filling up for 9:30 Sundays, beginning January 7. The Advent study led by Sue Kane will be completed on December 17th. A new 12-week study, Invitation to the Book of John, will be offered by Jeff Long at the 9:30 Sunday school hour beginning on January 28th, and a Lenten study, to be offered by Deborah Jones, is in the works. Additionally, a sermon series has been planned around the book Soul Feast, which may create an opportunity for a Church-wide study. House Church is continuing, with both the Tuesday and Wednesday groups having an average of 8 participants per meeting. New leaders and hosts are emerging from both groups. Although the Children's Ministry director is moving to another job, Children's Equip activities have already been laid out through the summer by the director and Pastor Jon. This will allow for excellent continuity in programming through the interviewing and hiring of a new director of Children's Ministry.

- Youth Ministries Andreas report
 - The Youth Christmas Party went very well on December 10. We had 20-25 kids and about four of those were new to the Youth ministry.
 - The Youth Open House continues to be strong with numbers regularly around 15. Many of these kids do not attend Aldersgate but come because friends have invited them.
 - The Youth Band will play at the 3:00 Christmas Eve Service.
 - We'll be having Youth Sunday on January 21 at both services with Andreas preaching, the Youth Band playing, and Youth participating in leading liturgy.
- UWF & UMM Lorrie Rezendes (vacation/absent) & Ed Little
 - <u>UMM</u>. Dinner on Nov. 14 was enjoyed by 65 attendees and netted a profit of \$189. Next dinner is a combined UWF/UMM dinner in March.
- Day School Liaison Barb Roach
 - The Day school is happy to report that this Fall's Consignment sale was its' most successful ever!
 - Dinner with Santa, held last week for Day School families, also became a successful fundraiser with the addition of the class Gift Baskets this year. The tickets for a chance at winning a gift basket (which you may have seen during Coffee Hour two weeks ago) were sold for several weeks and the winners were chosen and posted on Facebook last Friday. In addition to the many day school families who won a basket, Aldersgate's Ken Latta and Michelle Anderson also won a basket. Thank you for your support of both of these eventsthe monies earned will be used towards additional security measures within the building as well as increasing the teachers' salaries while only increasing tuition by 1.9%.
