


- proud of being able to use fully compostable paper products at the potluck buffet.

Summary and Analysis:

Pledged giving increased in July over June. Non-pledged giving was steady and if one considers that \$5,000 was contributed from the Lenten Appeal to Rising, Hope non-pledged giving increased. Expenses did not increase month-over-month resulting in a July end balance in the positive.

Comments and Notes

- Employee Retention Tax Credit application has been submitted.
- The annual "review" has been completed and the results read as follows: "Based on our review, we are
 not aware of any material modifications that should be made to accompanying financial statements in
 order for them to be in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting." (Full report is available
 to anyone who would like it.)

By way of definition and scope, "a review is substantially less in scope than an audit, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion."

- Account balances are within acceptable FDIC limits.
- Preparation of the 2024 Annual Budget will begin in August/September and will be presented at Conference in October. Worksheets will be distributed shortly, and I will be scheduling short meetings with all the team leads to discuss.
- The Endowment account reflects a negative balance of approximately \$405,000. This is an error and is
 in the process of being reviewed and corrected.
- Designated Accounts restricted account carries a \$5,000 negative balance. This resulted from the prior
 roof repairs exceeding the balance in this restricted account. I recommend that we transfer \$5000
 from a Shepherd Hall restricted account to cover this balance. Alternatively, this balance should be a
 "write off" as there are no fundraising plans to replenish this account.
