  - Strategic Plan Update Debbie Farson and John McRae
    - We have a lot of activity among the ministry and infrastructure teams implementing the ideas that came out of the Leadership Summit. Please encourage them to keep up that good work and remember to report out at the LT meetings in terms of team goals/strategies and where those stand.
  - Engage Barb Roach and Joe Salucci
    - Engage is looking forward to a busy spring beginning this Saturday with our Fresh Expression Prayer walk which will be at Huntley Meadows Park at 5:30 pm
    - On Easter Sunday be sure to stop by and get a picture of your family in front of our Easter Backdrop there will be a teen volunteer to help use your phone to capture Easter Photos.
    - In April we are looking forward to a Pierogi making Fresh Expression as well as a new Pub Theology Fresh Expression to be help on 429 at Chalkboard BBQ and hosted by Jon and Kingstown Communion.
    - Our two biggest Engage events are the Father Daughter dance to be held on Saturday 5/8 and the Jump into Summer Community picnic to be held on 6/2. We will need lots of Aldersgate support from congregants to host these exciting events for our community. Stay tuned to see how you can help.

    - <u>Connect Team Meeting</u>: We had our meeting on March 10th. Many thanks to Steve Larkin for hosting and providing delicious foot.
    - <u>Mentorship Program</u>: The Connect Team is suspending the mentorship program due to lack of interest. Only one family has signed up as a mentee. Only a couple of people signed up as mentors.
    - <u>Pizza with the Pastors</u>: The Connect Team suggested that we hand out information packets to families at Pizza with the Pastors. The packets would provide information on the

different ministry areas in the Church. Pastor Jon said Jill & Molly created a QR code card with this information, so we could use that instead.

- <u>Signup Genius Pages</u>: JD will review and update the pages accordingly for Ushers, Communion Servers, Lay Readers, Fellowship Time.
- Connect Worship, Steve Larkin and Dave Halladay
  - At 223, weekly worship attendance was down marginally from the previous month.
  - Holy Week worship volunteer slots are filled with the exception of Easter Sunday Communion Servers. Two requests have been sent to the Realm Communion Server list
  - Easter Sunday worship leads are: Steve Larkin, Sunrise; John Driscoll, 9:30 and John Pike, 11:00.
  - Emails have been sent to the Realm Worship Volunteer list requesting help for April and May.
- Equip Education, Sue Kane and Leslie Belcher
  - Sunday school classes and other small groups continued to meet as scheduled. Jeff Long's short-term study "Invitation to John" is almost complete, as is Deborah and Will Jones' Lenten Hymn study. The Christian Meditation class has been studying the book Soul Feast in conjunction with the sermon series based on that book. Children's Ministry has also been going strong, thanks to Melody Dillon, and we have successfully filled the part-time Children's Ministry Director position. Lisa Lee is beginning to shadow Melody and will be set to take over the Director position as Melody completes her interim duties in May. Finally, Equip Ministries has compiled informational material regarding the upcoming General Conference. This material will be made available on the church website. It was developed in conjunction with the pastors and staff.
    - Lisa's Report: As the new director of our children, I am continuing my onboarding with the help of Pastor Jon and our Intern, Melody. I plan to fulfill my duties as a teacher's aid with the Aldersgate Day School until the end of May, and then fully take on the responsibilities of this role. In the meantime, the Aldersgate Children's Ministry is continuing to engage and connect with our children by providing a variety of opportunities.

      - We have a "King's Kids" Worship Dance event planned for the morning of Palm Sunday during the Sunday school hour

      - We are planning a "Jesus Rocks" prayer rock painting event for our children on April 7th.
      - We have a May 19<sup>th</sup> Godly Play "Planting the Seed" event with the hopes of collaborating with our youth group for pot painting and seed planting afterward
      - We are also looking forward to a fun-filled Vacation Bible School this summer and are in the initial planning stages. July 29th—Aug 1<sup>st</sup> is our target week for this

- Wesley Hall ceiling water leak in small back room pipe replacement needed; ABM proposal in progress (no heat at Door 1 while repairs are pending) 1<sup>st</sup> dressing room. This item is complete
- Trustees storage cleanout on 3<sup>rd</sup> floor Ongoing
- Exterior water spigot repairs between doors 3 & 4 proposal pending The valves are all off so spigots are not leaking, will revisit before spring, end of March We need to schedule this soon. Tony and Sean to look at it first
- Roof Leak 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Update on roof inspection Roof not leaking, we need to watch the roof at the top of stairway adjacent to elevator.
- Parking Lot Pavement/Water Update Proposal to replacement pavements and repair water have come in with a range of \$240,000 to \$350,000. Another option would be to install a trench with pipe and gravel at the edge of the pavement/grass area and route it to the drainage system. The estimated cost for this would be \$12,000. We can approach the day school to see if they would be willing to cover half of the cost

  - Water shutoff valve installation to be able to isolate chillers pending proposal -\$\$\$ This will be done in spring We still have not received proposal, Tony to follow up so we can make a decision on whether to proceed. Also proposal for filter installation
  - Full property condition report Report provided, waiting on proposals to replace pipe that was not rated at high enough temperature and install VRF systems We still have not received proposal
  - Sanctuary HVAC Motor Heat is out in the sanctuary, replacement of the motor will be scheduled. Complete
  - Water Treatment Chemical drain and cleaned Feb 2021? Why is it still dirty? Need to follow up with ARC
  - Office areas still getting to hot. The problem could be in IVU system. We are looking for someone familiar with IVU or possibility of taking training
- Guback flooring replacement Lindsay to engage Endowment (Joni Koons & John Pike) team to seek funds for update Move this item to long term goal after we verify funding possibilities. Would prefer hard floors instead of carpet.

- We had an amazing turn out for the Leadership Summit and we wanted to be sure this slide deck from last month was in the newsletter, sent to LT and on website for people to also have access to. I worked with Molly to accomplish many of these tasks.
- Working on getting the word out for Save the Date: Serve Sunday with only 1 service, extended Sunday School that day since our worship will go a little longer, setup of the event. Promotion of the Faith Sharing class and what it will be about.
- Have been working with Sue, Paul, Randy and Paul to glean what information we want on our website to let people know what it is about, educate themselves topics of discussion and how to register for after discussions. Worked with Molly to get this on our website and get information to help guide people through the newsletter.
- Life Stages Seminar had a lot of working parts. Worked with Diane Tollefson and Steve Larkin on final details, room setups, access and IT needs. They had an awesome turn out and were very well organized!
- Lots of Lent preparations with the design and ordering of a lawn banner, which ended up sadly getting ripped to shreds so we will be working with a different company and will look into having a back support (plywood) so that it more protected. Invite Cards for Easter – design these and get them in the bulletins several weeks before Easter so congregants can give them out to neighbors, friends, family, co-workers, etc. Also working on an Event Card that will be in our Easter Bulletins so people know what Adult, Family and Children activities we have coming up.
- Continuing to work on updates of the website for our Ministry Groups so they are more easily understandable and educational for those who take time to view our website.
- Have ordered and received the Columbarium Plaque for Deal Tompkins. Family will have a service in June.
- Worked and helped execute another wonderful Staff Retreat. My part was to talk about our Strategic Priorities and how it relates to our Discipleship Pathway with our different ministry groups (Engage, Connect, Equip & Send).
- Still working on finishing up getting additional signers on our bank accounts so that we have someone other than Ed and myself to sign checks. Since I approve all purchases/invoices we need someone else to be able to sign to checks so that I am not doing both tasks, which would not be a good financial practice.
- Onboarding of 2 new employees Lisa Lee (Director of Children's Ministries) and Callie McIlwain. Receipt of all their new hire paperwork, IT and workstation needs, building access and the introduction to platforms and programs they will need access to.
- I oversee the functions of Office Management, HR Onboarding/Hiring Panel, IT, Receptionist (Christine McElwain), Finance Department (Jane Kratovil), Facility Management (Tony Pittman) and Digital Ministry (Molly Johnson) which includes our newsletter, social media platforms, website, slide production for worship services and weekly bulletin production for worship services. I work closely with all Ministry Teams, Finance, Trustees and Endowment.

Worship services for Holy week and SERVE Sunday are moving along nicely and look forward to Holy Week, though I will be away Plam Sunday for our granddaughters Baptism.

Our next Pizza with the Pastors events are Sunday April 21<sup>st</sup> after worship in Wesley- trying a new time, and Monday May 13 at 6pm in Guback.
